**Badly Mutilated Remains Found** in Barrel at West Penfield.

committed in this part of the state was brought to light Monday morning, when the brutally mutilated remains Francesco Manzello, aged thirty-three years, of Brooklyn, were found in an old whisky barrel in a gully about 200 yards from the Rochester & Sodus Bay trolley line power house, on the Webster\_state\_road, West\_Ponfield... The barrel was discovered by Frank C. Smith, aged-eighteen-years, of West Penfield, shortly after 9 o'clock, while he was making his round of traps which he had set in the gully.

The body was headless and dismembered, and had been in the barrel about twelve hours. Smith noticed the barrel when he walked down the path from the road, and after examining the contents, hurried over to A. D. Brown's home, nearby, to tell of the startling discovery. Mr. Brown called up District Attorney Barrett and the county authorities hastened to the scene in automobiles. 

It behooves everyone, man or woman, who cares for the welfare of the community and the patrons of the hall, to see that proper action is taken at once, by the town board and adequate facilities be provided to care for the audience in time of fire.
